<p>Old Business</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Lake Study Grants for 2017 – Otto and Nick prepared the December reimbursements for Natural Lakes, Stateline, and Oxbow Lakes. A call was made to Jill Sunderland at the DNR to fix issues of withholding money. Natural Lakes had a big difference in amounts. In early February \$42 -45,000 reimbursement to the town is expected. This same error will occur on the 2018 since the same method of determining amount was used both years. b. Lake Study Grant for 2018/2019 –13 Lakes reports are in progress. Whitewater’s reports will start coming. Annabelle Lake is already in. c. Shoreland study – Carlin Lake – No Carlin Lake Shoreland report is in yet. No known final costs yet. d. Hazardous Wake – Both sides of this issue have submitted arguments to the Vilas County Judge who will issue a ruling. Concern was made for the expedience of the ruling as it relates to the April elections. If the ordinance as written is to appear on the next Presque Isle ballot at least a month advance notice is required. There was also discussion about the voting boundary changes within Natural Lakes and if this would affect potential voting for the Hazardous Wake ordinance (if on the ballot). Eric Benn noted the voting ward changes only affect county level issues (part of Natural Lakes would vote for county level positions in Boulder Junction), not Town. Therefore, there would be no issue for potential voting for a Hazardous Wake ordinance. Also, relating to the election, Paul reported that there will be no primary for the position of Vilas County Supervisor since only 2 candidates are running: Pat Easley, the PI constable and Dick Logan, a volunteer at the Discovery Center and relative of Cathy Logan Weber. e. Other – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ann is collecting data from PITLC members on the number of wake-boats observed on their lakes this past summer. This is the first summer of activity tracked and the data will be helpful to analyze along with our lake surveys. Cathy Higley said the county would be interested in this data and she requests an update on the Hazardous Wake issue. Jeff Meessmann will update Cathy once the judge rules on the Hazardous Wake litigation. 2. Cathy Higley also spoke about the watershed protection of Rice Creek. White Water Assoc. will share data with her to fill in the gaps on where there is run-off erosion: at Round, Keego, Kitten, Maple, Mable, and Mud Lakes. 3. Cathy Higley also told of the phragmites patches found on Round Lake last summer. (From the boat launch, go north to the creek inlet. It’s there. It’s also at the canoe portage.) It has been genetically analyzed. This is the only place in PI where phragmites has been found. Crab Lake has native phragmites which are not invasive.
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<p>New Business</p>	<p>a. Reimbursement Hours for 2020 & 2021: if you haven't sent these to Nick please do. Nick will keep all emails in the future. These hours figure into our reimbursements and into grant requests.</p> <p>b. Internet and Association pledges: The PI Internet Committee is a sanctioned town committee and Nick, Cathy Logan Weber, and Eric Benn from our committee also serve on it. All of PI is underserved by the internet. Two ISPs (internet provider) have been identified to provide solutions. Estimates are needed and the Town will partner with one of the ISPs for a Public Service Commission (PSC) Grant to help fund the investment. The grant request must be filed before March, 17, 2022. It has been suggested that individuals and associations write letters/emails supporting the effort and even pledging money towards it. This indicates participation and helps earn points to win the grant. We are encouraged to contact our lake association and lake neighbors to send a letter, pledge an amount which isn't due until 2024. (Amortizing an amount over the next 2 years was suggested.) The monetary amount isn't as important (\$2 to hundreds of dollars) as the letter of support for helping our town have better internet service. Nick had a Zoom Board meeting with the Crab Lake Assoc. to accomplish this. He put out a high dollar amount to get their attention which worked. Information you can include: the project is to get fiber to your home, 1g which is the same as 1,000 mg; everyone will get it; the contracted company puts in money; the PSC puts in the most; the town the rest which could be up to \$4 million. An example is Boulder Junction: the cost there is \$7.5 million; Marshfield Clinic put in \$15,000. Cathy Logan Weber noted that the town did a mass mailing asking for support and only 100 people responded. 95% were for doing this project; 5% were against saying it may increase our taxes. Nick will supply us with the letter he sent as an example. The ISP (internet company) hasn't been chosen yet, but the town is committed to a ground based company not Starlink. We won't know the outcome until April or May. Letters are due by February. The school and Nicolet College will be asked to support this as it will enhance distance learning.</p>

<p>Old Business</p>	<p>a. Lake Study Grants for 2017: Final accounting (see attachment): Includes Oxbow Lake, Stateline Lake, Frontier Lakes and in Natural Lakes: Morton, McCollough, Beaver and Dunn Lakes. Also acknowledged, by Nick, were the Whitewater donations for each lake study.</p> <p>b. Lake Study Grant for 2018/2019: Where are we:</p> <p>1. Part of the discussion included details regarding DNR lake study grant reporting requirements especially pertaining to the new shoreline analysis section and whether the committee can or cannot modify DNR requirements after a grant has been awarded. Nick will send an educational email to the town board covering these issues. This is an offshoot of public comments at the April 7 town board meeting.</p> <p>After Nick read the letter intended for the PI Town Board, discussion centering around lake study grants and Dean Premo/Whitewater Company (WW) and a PI resident's criticism of PITLC re a perceived violation of her 4th Amendment rights and open fields doctrines by WW during a shoreline review for the purposes of a lake study grant application ensued. It was alleged by the resident that WW personnel were photographing their dock. John Maclean, town chair (and liaison), doesn't like the idea of a letter to the town board from Nick Williams, PITLC Chair, addressing a resident's concern of a perceived violation of their rights. Nick read the letter which states the requirement of shoreline inspection for grant awards comes from the DNR; PITLC does not set up the criteria, the DNR does. If the resident has concerns about shoreline review, they need to forward them to the DNR... not PITLC and not to the PI Town Board. Further, PITLC/WW undertakes tasks as directed by the DNR before any grant dollars are paid to the town. Nick emphasized that the DNR establishes the criteria (i.e., inspection of the shoreline). It was also noted, that everyone's property is continually being photographed via satellite and has been for many years.</p> <p>Discussion continued with the following comments re review of the Lake Study Grant for 2018/2019:</p>
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John M. objects to the letter Nick has written and read. He considers photographing a shoreline, one of many DNR requirements for reimbursement of grant monies, an invasion of privacy. He states that he thinks Whitewater is a sham and that he also objects to having to sign two checks for their services.

Richard P, speaking as an attorney who has spent time studying constitutional law, advises that photographing the shoreline from the water is entirely permissible under federal and state law.

Paul L explained that pictures were taken of logs in the water and vegetation on the shoreline, not private homes or docks.

Ann M. suggests if John receives complaints from citizens in the future, those complaints be forwarded to PITLC so a coordinator from the lake in question can contact that person to explain any issues as education is part of PITLC's purpose. Also, for further clarification, a survey could be taken to determine how many lakeshore residents are actually in favor of lakeshore studies vs those who are not.

Sarah S and Judy R both spoke of residents who are interested in learning more about lakeshore studies. Having any complainant document the offensive photo in question would be helpful.

2. 13 Lakes' reports are in progress. Whitewater's (WW) reports will begin arriving soon (Annabelle Lake report has already been received). Earlier in the year, Nick received the reports from WW, then sent them to PITLC committee members to review for errors. Comments by members were returned to Nick who then forwarded them to WW. Reports were repaired by WW, then sent to Kevin Gauthier/DNR who is projecting completion in May 2022. Two things were noted: 1. that in the past, final approval could take up to a year and 2. we only get paid by the DNR after all reports are approved.

Discussion re these reports:

Sarah S: Rusty crayfish in PI Lake appear to have reduced. Could be due to gut bacteria or a virus, could just be cyclical or food supply. Addressing plants in PI Lake, it was noted some aquatic plants thrive in disturbed water whereas others grow better in quiet area. Sarah also commented re WW's willingness to answer questions during the time they were inspecting the shoreline on Oxbow Lake

Tom P: Pyrethrin from mosquito spraying could be an issue in changes seen in PI Lake.

Ann M: There is a virus affecting the population of rusty crayfish on McCullough. Smallmouth Bass have figured out the “rusties” are worth going after.

Nick W: Perhaps populations are in a dropping cycle. Also, Northland College in Ashland has been contacted. Crab Lake has again hired the same landing boat monitor.

Paul L: Dean Premo/WW talked about fluctuations in plants and other aquatic life during one of the Papoose Lake studies during a pontoon cruise and how this is a naturally occurring shift in prevalent plant life.

Nick reminds us that another benefit of our surveys is the recurring relationship PITLC has maintained for many years with the same vendor, Whitewater.

Eric B to John M: You’re hearing good quality scientific data here. It’s complicated to collect with a systematic survey. And...it’s not cheap!

Philip P: Appreciates the establishing of where we are with our lakes today and working to preserve their quality.

It was noted by a committee member “we are not scientists” and that the most important factor in lakes studies is the education of residents. PITLC has been supporting PI lakes’ studies for 17 years. It has been found that most people do want to learn and do the right thing for the lakes.

Dave V is happy to see WW include lake monitoring on individual lakes in their reports.

- c. **Shoreland study – Carlin Lake:** In progress. Grant work was done in 2020. Photos are not posted on DNR website yet. As soon as they are, WW will be able to finish up.
- d. **Hazardous Wake Ordinance:** PI Town Board determined there would be no new ordinance as VC Circuit Court Judge did not rule in favor of the Last Wilderness Alliance request for a ruling of direct legislation. A referendum question regarding the ordinance was not included on the April 15, 2022, ballot. An unidentified member mentioned that the DNR is beginning to look at legislation for this issue and WI Lakes are beginning to lobby as well.
- e. **Internet Update:** The Town’s cost share has been reduced and the PSC grant will be covered if it’s awarded to Charter. There will be no tax increase to cover this cost. The Broadband Committee appreciated all the letters of support. If Charter is awarded this grant, all property owners in PI will receive updated broadband access. If we receive

	<p>the grant, everyone in PI will get the same level of service at the same cost.</p> <p>f. Other: Nick/Sarah noted that fishermen on PI Lake last fall thought they saw evidence of spiny water fleas and reported same to the DNR. Samples were taken, there were no invasives found. Much like an occurrence on Stateline Lake a couple years back when a MI DNR person suspected curly pond weed which turned out to be a native plant and not the cpw invasive. It's good to have people looking out for our lakes!!</p>	
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<p>New Business</p>	<p>a. Wisconsin Conservation Congress Reminder: The online 2022 survey is currently available for the public to make comments. Find the webpage @ DNR.wi.gov and type in "Spring Hearings" in the search box. Sign in and follow the directions.</p> <p>b. Pipe Ponds: Previously, PITLIC was sometimes dragged into actions in the park. For instance, we do not do fish stocking, so those looking to work on this issue were directed to Parks & Rec as it's more related to "parks" than to "lakes."</p> <p>c. Other: Bob R addressed his and Judy's recent trip to the Lakes & Rivers Annual Convention in Steven's Point and shared with us some of the topics of discussion, including the difficulties of increased traffic facing Big Cedar Lake near Milwaukee. Paul L: Spoke to including links on the website for related lake issues to think about. Ann M is willing to create such an additional or updated webpage with links for issues of interest to PITLC followers. Addressing the cost of Lake Studies: Judy R addressed how our money has been well-spent for keeping our lakes clean and free of invasive species. She said that on Carlin Lake, packets of suitable information for lake living are given to new owners. She also remarked that the reasons people give for moving to PI/Carlin Lake are the same today as 20 years ago - quiet living and clean water. Our biggest resource is our lakes! Dissolved Oxygen Meter: Gary Plouff/Frontier Lakes wishes to use the PITLC dissolved oxygen meter. He will contact Paul L for calibration of the unit and instruction on using it when it is required. Monitors may do readings as soon as soon as two days post ice out. A comment was made that 2 weeks for water chemistry may be the most optimum time to begin. PITLC Meetings: John M would like someone to be at town hall to greet the public for Zoom meetings held from another location and suggested hiring someone do that. Cathy LW agreed. Susie G suggested using the library's OWL system. Recap by Nick: Nick referred to tonight's meeting as an "airing of grievances" and suggested there is more we can do as a committee, including additional PITLC webpage link information and teaching opportunities.</p>

Old Business

- a. **Lake Study Grants for 2018/2019 (see accounting attachments):** Nick explained the figures. Waiting for the DNR to finish reviewing. \$28,077.11 is town share of 13 lakes studied. Donation from Whitewater: \$9,532.00. Kevin Gauthier has acknowledged receipt of paperwork from Whitewater. Nick expects full payment from the DNR by year-end 2022.
- b. **Shoreland study – Carlin Lake:** In progress. No new information to date.
- c. **Hazardous Wake Ordinance:** Judge’s ruling under appeal. Appeal has been filed.
- d. **Wisconsin Conservation Congress Results:** 2 Dane Cty motions passed by 94%; Vilas Cty motions passed by 80%.
- e. **Maintenance - Dissolved oxygen meter:** Fritz B & Paul L said \$320.00 is cost for maintenance and cleaning supplies for the 2022 season. Nick got charges from Fritz & asked Lorine to send him a check. The meter will soon be ready for wide use. Calibration has been done for conductivity. Replaced a sensor. Sarah Sisbach wants to use it on PI Lake and will call Paul.
- f. **Other – None**

New Business

a. All Town Presentation Comments (see attachments):

An History of Grants was reviewed by Nick. In 2021, 8 lake studies were sent to DNR for review. Nick's comments are attached. \$13,000/year average annual budget for the grants. John stated he thinks too much money has been spent over the years on monitoring our lakes and that 3 tests per lake (testing began in the early 2000's) is too many. Discussion followed re the importance of each individual lake's histories.

Sarah said it's the DNR's decision as to what is a grant to be funded. It's valuable to us right now because of the current wake boat issue. Our data is good. Dave Bogan pointed out that the DNR decides how much and where grant awards are made and that is out of the purview of this town/committee. PI is the only township in Vilas Cty that does not have any aquatic invasives species (other than rusty crayfish and yellow iris). The potential of having lakes become infected is ever present and we need to be ready should this occur. Dave V advises John that almost every lake is different from others. The intent is to track trends. One study – one point; second study – up/down/what?; third study – drops possible. Now there's some idea and we can guess the trend...more data, more knowledge of the trend. You need historical data to see what's happening in the lake. Otto N reflects that the DNR thinks studies go stale after 5 or 6 years and fresh studies are needed. Nick would like to see our data consolidated by someone who can interpret our data to show trends. Tom Wierzba says Big Lake embraces these studies because they feel it creates a good base to follow and is money well-spent. Tom went out with Quita Sheehan/VC today; she mentioned putting Whitewater data to good use in helping them with the erosion study and establishing criteria with Rice Creek Watershed Project.

b. Big Lake, Van Vliet Lake and PI Lake CB/CW Grant:

This grant is shared. Tom W explained that the DNR won't allow a grant for less than 200 hours. Big L. put in for 300 hours. Ronie wanted more support for VVL but it only shows up under Big L., not PI L. and VVL. Ronie has spoken with Discovery Center and the largest amount the DNR will reimburse is 75% of cost up to \$4,000. Sarah spoke to only one of the boat landings being monitored and that the PI Lake Board wants monitors at the 2nd landing, as well. She said a wash station on PI Lake would be nice, they'll be discussing it further. Sarah opined that boaters on PI Lake are well-educated and accept the rules, demonstrating that CB/CW projects work.

c. An award: Congratulations to Ann Mawicke, who recently received the Invader Crusader Award. She was congratulated by Nick and PITLC members!

d. Reflection on today's meeting: Attendees by Zoom, 11 and attendees in person at the CC, 8. Judy stated she appreciates the Zoom, glad she can attend from Iowa.
